

**Snow Removal:** Priority of work for snow removal and de-icing is as follows: 1st are Snow Emergency Routes & Streets Around Schools, 2nd are Other Streets, and 3rd are Alleys/Cul-de-sacs (These may change based on trash collections day). The Borough may pre-treat with salt, but no later than when 1 inch of snow or when icy conditions are expected. Please remember that when the temperature falls below 20°F, salting is not as effective. Here are some tips for snow removal:

- Please understand that proper plowing techniques cannot prevent the deposit of snow in driveways
- If possible, park vehicles in driveways and off the roadway. Parking in driveways off the street helps crews plow back to the curb and supplies you with a parking space again
- Please do not throw or place snow/ice onto the street. Borough ordinance prevents this activity
- Be mindful of pedestrians following a snowfall. Borough ordinance requires that snow/ice be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours after the end of any snow, sleet, or freezing rain

## What Is Recyclable & What Is Trash?

### RECYCLE THESE :

(Please rinse all food containers)

**Cartons:** milk, wine, soup, juice boxes (please rinse and crush, remove straws)

**Plastic Bottles**—please remove lids, caps

**Plastic food containers**, labeled with numbers 1 through 7

**Yogurt, cottage cheese, margarine tubs**

**Aluminum cans and bottles** (please crush to make more room)

**Tin cans** (please rinse)

**Paper:**

- cereal and similar food boxes (please remove liners)
- newspaper
- phonebooks, phonebooks, magazines and catalogs: please bundle these together with string or in a paper bag
- paper egg cartons
- cardboard boxes (Please remove all packing material from cardboard boxes, unless it's made of paper. If you have large or numerous boxes, please flatten them out and tie them together.)

Please put shredded paper in the trash.

### PLEASE THROW THESE IN THE TRASH:

- All GLASS that is not bottles and jars (see below)
- Ceramics (china, mugs, clay pots)
- Diapers
- Food waste and all food wrappers, plastic and paper.
- Any paper or plastic that is wet or stained with food.
- Tissue paper (napkins, paper towels, etc.)
- Shipping or padded envelopes
- All plastic packaging material (foam peanuts, bubble wrap)
- Wax-coated cardboard (usually bulk food packaging)
- Aluminum foil
- Clothing hangers (offer these to your drycleaner)
- Plastic tableware—knives, forks and spoons
- Paper or plastic plates, bowls and cups
- Light bulbs of all types
- Christmas lights, extension cords
- Garden hoses
- Plastic bags—these can go in the trash, but most area grocery stores have recycling bins for clean, dry plastic bags

**Street Sweeper Reminder:** Street sweeping runs from the beginning of April until the end of November every year. Friday, November 29 is the last day of street sweeping in 2024. Please be aware of all posted signs when parking your vehicle(s) and remember that all other violations will be enforced during the months the street sweeper does not run.
